






WELCOME TO THE NORTH SHORE


NEIGHBORHOOD




NILES/LINCOLNWOOD

Located just 14 miles north of downtown Chicago, Wilmette is one of the original North Shore communities. It has been ranked by BusinessWeek, as one of the best places in the U.S. to raise children and today is home to nearly 28,000 residents. 

In addition to a beautiful public beach, Kenilworth enjoys flowing fountains, lacrosse and baseball fields, parks, gardens and a Historical Society that enthusiastically preserves the community's history. 
NEIGHBORHOOD






GLENVIEW


NEIGHBORHOOD






